

# PROCEEDINGS: Hancock Co.

## HANCOCK COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

May 31, 2022

Garner, Iowa

The Hancock County, Iowa, Board of Supervisors met in adjourned session on the above captioned date pursuant to adjournment with Supervisors Florence (Sis) Greiman, Gary Rayhons, and Jerry J. Tlach present. Absent: none.

The minutes of May 23, 2022 meeting were read and approved.

On motion by Supervisor Rayhons, seconded by Supervisor Greiman and carried unanimously, the Board gave approval to the following: Hancock County General Assistance Manual effective June 1, 2022. Awarded the project for Drainage District no. 57 Main Tile and Lateral 49 Tile Repairs to Rognes Brox. Excavating, Inc., Lake Mills, in the amount of \$265,158 as best and lowest of six bids received. Tentatively approve the post rain-fall engineer's report amendment regarding Drainage District no. 174 Ditch Repair and set the date and time for formal hearing with land-owners for July 11, 2022 at 10:00 a.m.

On motion by Supervisor Greiman, seconded by Supervisor Rayhons and carried unanimously, the Board gave approval to the following Resolution:

### RESOLUTION 2022-035

#### FEDERAL FUNCTIONAL CLASSIFICATION REVIEW APPLICATION

WHEREAS, functional classification is the process by which streets and highways are grouped into

classes according to the character of service they are intended to provide; and

WHEREAS, Hancock County, periodically reviews the system of streets and highways for appropriate changes to classification of the various segments of the system; and

WHEREAS, a recent review of the system has revealed the need for a change to the federal functional classification of road segments due to increased traffic with school district merger.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Hancock County hereby requests the Iowa Department of Transportation to request the Federal Highway Administration to make the following changes in federal functional classification.

Changes to Federal Functional Classification System:

Revise the federal functional classification from Minor Collector to Major Collector for the following segments:

On B36, from R68 to R70. 2.0 miles

On R70, from B36 to US 18. 2.3 miles

No further business to come before the Board, motion made to adjourn at 11:01 a.m. by Supervisor Rayhons and carried. All Supervisors present voting, "Aye," session to adjourn and will meet again on June 6, 2022.
