The Garner City Council met at City Hall on October 10, 2023. Mayor Schmidt called the meeting to order at 5:30 PM with the following councilors present: Glen Juhl, Amber Jenniges, Marlene Lewerke, Damon Quandt, and Don Bell. Also present were the City Clerk Karen Halder, and City Administrator Jim Collins.

A motion by Lewerke to approve the agenda was supported by Juhl. Motion carried 5-0.

Public Input: none
A motion by Jenniges to approve the consent agenda that consisted of the September 26 & October 3 minutes, claims report, approve Diana Mullenbach and Kaidence Wilson as P&R Cheer Instructors, acceptance of Mike Bahnon's resignation from the Park & Rec Board, approval of Ryan Sonquist's appointment to the P&R Board, and approval of Matt Schoneman's appointment to the Zoning Board was supported by Bell. Motion carried 5-0.

A motion by Lewerke to set Trick or Treat for Tuesday, October 31 from 5 to 7 PM was supported by Quandt. Motion carried.

A motion by Juhl to approve the Golf Foundation's request to fund the purchase of a greens mower and a greens roller was supported by Lewerke. Motion carried 5-0.

Bill Paulus, Golf Foundation Treasurer, updated Council on the following:

- Brandon Renner has been hired to serve as the course Superintendent for the next season

- Grass Masters, Algona, Iowa has been contracted to fertilize in the spring

- They also work on irrigation systems and may be retained to maintain the course system

- Twenty-two dead or diseased trees will be removed from the course

- Mayor Schmidt thanked the Foundation for their volunteering to keep the course beautiful

- Mayor Schmidt also thanked Roger Schmidt for his landscaping work

A motion by Quandt to approve Quality Pump & Control's quote to update the golf course pumphouse

electrical system and install two VFDs for \$29,695.00 was supported by Bell. Motion carried 5-0.

A motion by Jenniges to purchase two picnic tables, one for Oldenburg Park and one for Cardinal Park, was supported by Lewerke. Motion carried 5-0.

Council reviewed a quote to purchase an electric space heater for the Tourist Park Shelter. It was decided to get a second quote for a natural gas space heater for comparison.

A motion by Quandt to approve Resolution no. 2023 - 86, a resolution approving the paving of the concession area and west parking lot at the Garner Baseball/Softball Complex for \$274,036.00 was supported by Bell. Ayes: Quandt, Jenniges, Bell, Juhl, and Lewerke. Nays: none. Motion carried.

A motion by Lewerke to approve Resolution no. 2023 - 87, a resolution accepting a \$5,000 donation to the Garner Baseball/Softball Complex project from KJ & Karen Hueneman, was supported by Jenniges. Ayes: Quandt, Jenniges, Bell, Juhl, and Lewerke. Nays: none. Motion carried.

A motion by Juhl to approve the 2022 State Street Project Pay Estimate no. 9 and release final retainage was supported by Jenniges. Motion carried 5-0.

Councilor Quandt directed Public Works to trim a tree blocking the Yield sign at the corner of Henschen Street and Allen Avenue.

Mayor Schmidt will convene a meeting with GHV administrators, student council, and city representatives to discuss the student tradition of toilet papering during homecoming week.
