# Belmond-Klemme Community School District Public Measure WV:

SHALL THE FOLLOWING PUBLIC MEASURE BE ADOPTED?

Shall the Board of Directors of the Belmond-Klemme Community School District, in the Counties of Franklin, Hancock, and Wright, State of Iowa, for the purpose of purchasing and improving grounds; constructing schoolhouses or buildings and opening roads to schoolhouses or buildings; purchasing of buildings; purchase, lease or lease-purchase of technology and equipment; paying debts contracted for the erection or construction of schoolhouses or buildings, not including interest on bonds; procuring or acquisition of libraries; repairing, remodeling, reconstructing, improving, or expanding the schoolhouses or buildings and additions to existing schoolhouses; expenditures for energy conservation; renting facilities under lowa Code Chapter 28E; purchasing transportation equipment for transporting students; lease purchase option agreements for school buildings or equipment; purchasing equipment authorized by law; or for any purpose or purposes now or hereafter authorized by law, be authorized for a period of ten (10) years, to levy annually, a voter-approved physical plant and equipment property tax not to exceed One Dollar (\$1.00) per One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) of the assessed valuation of the taxable property within the school district commencing with the levy for collection in the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026, or each year thereafter?

# West Fork Community School District Public Measure DU:

SHALL THE FOLLOWING PUBLIC MEASURE BE ADOPTED?

Shall the Board of Directors of the West Fork Community School District in the Counties of Cerro Gordo, Franklin, Hancock, and Wright, State of Iowa, be authorized to contract indebtedness and issue General Obligation Bonds in an amount not to exceed \$16,865,000 to provide funds to remodel, repair, and improve the HVAC and electrical systems at the Rockwell elementary building and the Sheffield middle school / high school building, including related remodeling and improvements; to replace roof sections at both facilities; to replace horizontal runs of the domestic water system piping at the Sheffield facility; and to add a secure entrance at the Sheffield facility?

This notice of the CITY-SCHOOL ELECTION is given by order of the Hancock County Commissioner of Elections in compliance with the laws of Iowa.

Pre-registered voters are required to provide an approved form of identification at the polling place before receiving and casting a regular ballot. Voters who are not pre-registered – such as voters registering to vote on election day – and voters changing precincts must also provide proof of residence. A voter who is unable to provide an approved form of identification (or prove residence if required) 1) may have the voter's identity/residence attested to by another registered voter in the precinct, 2) prove identity and residence using Election Day Registration documents, or 3) cast a provisional ballot and provide proof of identity/residence at the county auditor's office by November 13, 2023 at 12:00 p.m. Election Day Registrant attesters must provide an approved form of identification. SERVICE GOAL:
The Kanawha Police Department recognizes its responsibility to serve all the public to the best of its ability. To instill confidence in the community, the Kanawha Police Department has developed this complaint form for citizens to express their complaints. Citizens with complaints about the Kanawha Police Department or individual officers are encouraged to file a complaint. Once a complaint is filed, the Kanawha Police Department will conduct an objective investigation into the com-

INVESTIGATION OF COMPLAINTS:
The Kanawha Police Department

complaints will be investigated fairly and thoroughly. Generally, an investigation into a complaint will be concluded ten (10) days following receipt of the complaint, however, in some cases the investigation may take longer. If through the investigation it is determined that criminal conduct has occurred, formal charges will be handled through the court system. Any public information that can be shared with the complainant will be shared at the conclusion of the investigation. Iowa Code Section 22.7 requires that any discipline imposed on public employees remain confidential, and therefore, any disciplinary action imposed on an employee as a result of a complaint will not be shared with any other parties, including the complainant.
