## GENERAL INFORMATION

INFORMATION This water supply obtains its water from the buried sand and gravel, limestone and dolomite of the Buried Sand and Gravel- Mississippian aquifer. The Buried Sand and Gravel-Mississippian aquifer was determined to be slightly susceptible to contamination because the characteristics of the aquifer and overlying materials provide moderate protection from contaminants at the land surface. The Buried Sand and Gravel-Mississippian wells will be slightly susceptible to surface contaminants such as leaking underground storage tanks, contaminant spills, and excess fertilizer application.
