During periods where the City has employed a full-time peace officer, the City shall pay the County \$200.00 an hour for calls that the County covers, and the City peace officer does not respond to. If the County responds to a call, the call will be billed for a minimum of 2 hours. Payment shall be made monthly to the County. Upon hiring a full-time peace officer, Kanawha shall be responsible for providing 24/7 police coverage to its citizens. The City shall file this agreement with the Iowa Secretary of State and the Hancock County Recorder as required by Iowa Code 28E.4. DURATION. This agreement

5. <u>DURATION</u>. Inis agreement shall commence July 1, 2025, and continue in perpetuity, unless terminated by either party. County shall provide the City with at least three months written notice of a change in cost. The cost will automatically increase at an equal percentage to the Social Security cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) each year without written protice.

6. EXERCISE OF POWERS. No separate legal entity is created by this agreement. The Sheriff shall administer the performance of this agreement.

7. MODIFICATION. This agreement may be modified by written agreement of the parties.
